
# **B&ECPL Experiences Busiest Year in Its History/Inside**

*Circulation Reaches Record-Breaking Highs* ERIE COUNTY – The B&ECPL experienced the busiest year in its history in 2003. Patron self-initiated requests and online renewals contributed to an 8.8% increase in circulation activity, with totals rising from 8,155,364 in 2002 to 8,875,762 in 2003. A record-shattering 117,660 boxes of library materials and supplies were shipped among B&ECPL's 52 locations, representing a 20% increase over 2002.

### Ground Broken for New East Side Library

BUFFALO – Public officials from the local and state level, community leaders, B&ECPL trustees and staff, library supporters and residents attended the groundbreaking ceremony



for a new 20,000 square foot branch library on the City of Buffalo's East Side. Using the African village as inspiration for the building's design, the \$4.2 million dollar project will include an African American Resource Room, adult and youth reading rooms, technology training lab, auditorium, 35 parking spaces and an African motif in the block facade. The new building will be named after **Frank E. Merriweather, Jr.**, editor and publisher of *The Criterion* newspaper.

Reinventing the Wheel

BUFFALO - From May through October, the Central Library hosted a special programming series to coordinate with Art on Wheels, the region-wide art in public spaces project, displaying outdoor sculptures based on the wheel, transportation and recycling. The Sprockets to Rockets series featured a different transportation theme each month, which was explored through entertaining and informative programming for both children and adults.

Zoomtext, the advanced screen magnification program for visionimpaired computer users, was installed on at least one workstation at every B&ECPL location.

At a special event in September, library supporters, staff, trustees and public officials celebrated the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Blasdell Branch.

After seeking public input for one year, the B&ECPL Board of Trustees approved a demonstration project where Erie County Executive Joel Giambra agreed to provide capital funds to construct a new, state-of-theart library to replace the Cazenovia and Dudley branches in South Buffalo.

# **BUSINESS BRIEFS**

For the first time in 20 years, the B&ECPL increased the fine rates it charges for the overdue return of library materials. Key changes include increases in the basic fine for regular library materials from 10 cents to 25 cents per day, children's materials from 2 cents to 10 cents per day, videocassettes and DVDs from \$1 to \$2 per day (excluding children's titles) and the maximum fine for regular items from \$10 to \$15. The revenue generated from the increases was used to bridge gaps in the 2003 Library operating budget and sustain public service at 2002 levels.

# **TECHNOLOGY**

Section F

BUFFALO – Through a generous \$50,000 grant from Verizon SuperPages, the Central Library opened a second computer training lab in March. The Libraries Expand Access for Discovery (LEAD) Lab provides teachers, students and adults access to computers, the Internet and instructional opportunities.

The fully-illustrated CD-ROM, Huck Finn: The Complete Buffalo and Erie County Public Library Manuscript – Teaching and Research Digital Edition, was completed in June. Produced through collaboration with the Library Foundation of Buffalo & Erie County, the CD-ROM includes a variety of resources for users of all ages and educational levels to understand and appreciate Mark Twain's Adventures of Huckleberry Finn in a completely new manner. The project was funded primarily through the generosity of the John R. Oishei Foundation with additional funding received from the Baird Foundation and the Constance Stafford Charitable Lead Trust.

In a joint effort, the Erie County Department of Environment and Planning and the B&ECPL offered a recycling program to address the tens of thousands of cell phones no longer in use. Beginning in December, individuals were able to take old cell phones to any library within the B&ECPL System. For every phone returned, the local library received \$3 to be used for programming or new materials. The cell phones collected through this program were shipped to a company that either refurbished or recycled the components.
